Out of the 7474 schools which reported, 3639 report school grounds of one acre, 915 report grounds of more than an acre, 2920 report grounds of less than an acre. The number of rural schools in the various groups is as follows: 2264 one acre, 573 more than an acre, 2740 less than an acre. Plate 13 shows school grounds and playground apparatus conditions graphically. If school boards would see to it that school grounds were of adequate size it would be of inestimable value in helping the play spirit among country, village and city children.
